EDUCATION

Since pediatric cancers are different from adult cancers, giving children adult cancer therapies results in multiple life-threatening side-effects to cancer treatments. Like outdated, hand-me-down clothes, adult cancer therapies just don't fit kids' bodies. But while second-hand clothes might be vintage and cool, treatments should be tailored to fit the individual.
